- Camping is only permitted for members of the Showman's Guild and campers associated with an Event held at the Cairns Showgrounds. Proof of attendance for showground event or member of Showman's Guild will be required.
- Animals are to be kept on leads **AT ALL TIMES**. Any dogs not on leads will be removed from the grounds at the expense of the person named above. All animal waste must be collected and disposed of appropriately.
- The Cairns Show Association accepts no responsibility for damaged or stolen property.
- All hire fees must be paid prior to commencement of accommodation period.
- Dump water pits are available and all wastewater hoses must be discharged directly to these dedicated dump points.
- For compliance all camping booking forms will be passed on to the Cairns Regional Council Regulatory Compliance Department – Attention Environment Officer / Regulator.
- Campers must not contaminate waterways, roadside gutters, stormwater drainage as per the Environmental Protection Regulation 2019. Please refer to the attached Schedule 10 – Prescribed Water Contaminants. Laundry wastewater may be discharged to ground provided the lines are appropriately covered with a filter socks that measure between 50-100 micron. These socks must be securely attached to ensure no seepage. Feet socks and stockings are not appropriate methods.
- The Cairns Show Association is operating under a COVID Safe Venue Plan and campers agree to comply with all health safety measures in place.
- All campers agree to leave their camp site in a clean and tidy manner.
