Jo Bates has been working professionally with dogs for over 10 years.

After initially volunteering at a local shelter, in 2009, she commenced studying a Certificate III in Dog Behaviour and Training which included scent work as an elective subject. This sparked a love of the game and a moment in time to appreciate what a dog's nose can do!

Jo volunteered with the RSPCA from 2010. In 2011, Jo became a paid staff member working in a variety of roles including running the behaviour department and as a specialist in the education team. Jo introduced and applied her knowledge of scent work and the games used to many aspects of shelter life which enriched and enhanced the lives of many long stay dogs. After leaving the RSPCA to focus on her own business and passion in scent work, Jo continued to volunteer at the shelter to build up and develop the shelter dog nose work program at the RSPCA (VIC) in Burwood and their regional centre in Pearcedale.

Jo currently runs her own business, Crazy Canines, which specialises in behaviour and training and K9 Nose Work instruction.

Since 2009, Jo has continued to develop her knowledge and passion for the sport through attending multiple workshops in person with speakers such as Bob Bailey, Fred Helfers and Jill-Marie O'Brien—the co-founder of K9 Nose Work.

In 2018, Jo became a certified nose work instructor (CNWI) for the NACSW (National Association of Canine Scent Work). Jo has continued to pursue further education in the scent work discipline by attending workshops, webinars and online training such as NACSW, Fenzi Dog Sports Academy, Scent Work University, Dogs Of Course and Scentsabilities NoseWork.

In 2021, Jo became a foundation ANKC Scent Work judge in Victoria. She has judged regularly since then including at the ACT Gundog Society's May 2022 Scent Work trials. Jo has been invited to judge for Dogs ACT in September 2022.

Murphy, Jo's Springer Spaniel, has achieved his Scent Work Novice title and is currently working towards his Scent Work Advanced title. Her Papillon, Louis, is in training, but loves to hunt out odour in a variety of scenarios while he learns about the more complex challenges in nose work. Louis will begin trialing in 2023.

Jo runs demo sessions, fun days, workshops and courses in scent work and on behavioural topics for a number of local obedience dog clubs in Victoria (including: Mornington Obedience Dog Club, Mornington Peninsula Community Dog club, Peninsula Obedience Dog Club, Peninsula Positive Paws Dog Club and Berwick Obedience Dog Club).

Jo is always willing to talk further and share knowledge about this amazing sport that we can do with our dogs!

HOW TO APPLY:

- Dogs ACT members are invited to apply to attend the workshops and information evenings by submitting the attached brief questionnaire.
- Organisers will review the applications received to ensure a good mix of skill and experience at the right levels at each workshop.
- Organisers will identify dogs to invite as demonstration dogs.
- Subject to numbers, you will be offered a participant position and for some, a demonstration dog position

If you are accepted as a participant, you will be required confirm and to pay a non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 within 72 hours of notification. If you do not respond within this timeframe your position will be reallocated .

The balance must be paid two weeks prior to your respective workshop.

DOGS ACT Members Only Restricted Trialling Workshops

About the Workshops:

- There will be a half day on each element and the challenges for handler/dog including handling skills and approach to a search area.
- The workshops will provide practical training skills and exercises to enable handlers and dogs to successfully move to the next trialling level.
- The attached table highlights the proposed outcomes from the workshops.
- The workshops are targeted to specific levels and experience to ensure participants get the most out of the sessions.
- For example, those new to trialling, currently in Novice, or new to Advanced, are encouraged to apply for the Novice-Advanced workshop to ensure they are developing a sound training skill set for the trialing environment. Advanced-Excellent triallers are encouraged to apply for the Advanced-Excellent and Master workshops which will focus on the more complex training needs and problem solving skills required at these levels.
- It is hoped that those seeking to attend the one day Master workshop will also attend the Advanced-Excellent workshop as the skills will naturally build on to each other.
- These workshops are not a 'my dog has this problem, how do I fix that?'

Demonstration dogs

- Jo will use demonstration dogs to demonstrate particular exercises and how to grow them, or how to apply them to different types of dogs.
- Some participants will be invited to bring their dogs along as 'demonstration dogs' ie Jo
 will select particular dogs to demonstrate different training exercises eg elevation a
 small dog and a large dog to show the different approaches, challenges and training techniques (for Advanced-Excellent eg inaccessible hides same reason)
- Dogs will need to be crated and kept in the car when not working.
- You are invited to nominate your dog for a demonstration position on your Expression of Interest (Attached) *Link*.

Information and discussion evenings

Information and discussion evenings will be offered on the night before the workshops and will focus on an overview of the Scent Work Rules, what the trialling requirements are at each level and what the judge is looking for, what skills a trialling team should be working on and the do's and the don'ts and the penalties that can be applied and for what. Numbers will be capped at 30.
