Judging starts: 4.00pm, but may be delayed if temperature is over 32°

Check-in and measuring: between 3.15 to 3.45pm.

Vetting: There will be no vetting at check-in, but organisers reserve the right to vet any dog if it deems necessary.

Catalogue: provided free on the Canberra SprintDog Facebook page, the day before the trial.

Catering: CDC's shop will NOT be open, but tea & coffee will be available.

Awards: Qualification Certificates and ribbons.

Camping: is not available on the club grounds.

Important additional information (Please read).

- Entries restricted to two entries per person. This restriction might be lifted if space permits.
- Exhibitors to bring their dogs height card. Dogs without a card to be measured at check-in.
- Exhibitors need to arrange their own handlers.
- All handlers must be financial members of their state member body. Handlers must be over 16 years of age.
- Exhibitors should enter the name of their handler/helper in showmanager to aid with cataloguing.
- All dogs will run in the first round. Dogs that do not complete the course, will not be eligible to compete in the second round.
- Bitches in season are not allowed on the club grounds.
- The organisers reserve the right to make any changes to ensure the smooth conduct of the trial.
- The organisers reserve the right to accept or reject entries.
- This trial is run under the rules & regulations of Dogs ACT.
